Dear Residents:

My eighth year as a municipal councillor is already coming to an end and I will not be running for a third term. Over the last year, an extensive consultation was held to update the Plateau’s priorities. More than 600 people took part in this consultation.

The establishment of a library (\$13.1 million) and of a secondary school, as well as the construction of the first phase of the central park (\$2.3 million) are significant elements that will allow to build the core of the Plateau urban village, which will include local services and a public square. Announcements are expected this fall.

Another emerging factor that will need to be addressed is the Plateau’s aging population.

In my opinion, three of the City’s and Quebec Government’s orientations still conflict with concerns raised by the Plateau residents:

- Road safety and road sharing;
- Densification and social diversity versus environment and quality of life;
- Public transit and traffic congestion.
